GIFT AID

A Government scheme that enables the Parish to reclaim tax paid on donations to the parish. Taxpayers are asked to sign a Gift Aid declaration authorising the parish to reclaim from the Inland Revenue, tax paid on Offertory donations paid in numbered Offertory envelopes or by bankers order. For every £1 donated, the parish can reclaim an extra 28 pence.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION

Couples who are married in the Catholic Church benefit from our parish marriage preparation programme. Devised by married couples the programme examines various aspects of married relationship.
